- 1) Age before beauty. The oldest event on the AGA tour is a singles event...the 39th annual Moopy Memorial.
- 2) Multiple formats come into play at the RAW DP Challenge doubles event. For the 25th time, the twosomes will play best ball for the 1st 6 holes, alternate shots for six holes, then scramble the rest of the round.
- 3) Get your team together at Cronin's for the first 4-some scramble of the year, the 10-year-old Cronies.
- 4) The first doubles event is the 36th annual International. A modified Stableford scoring system is used to accumulate points during the round.
- 5) The 4th annual Mike & Ike is a foursome scramble. The event is run by a father and son on Father's Day.
- 6) The second and last singles event on the calendar is the 36th annual 2-day woody. 18 holes are played on both Saturday and Sunday.
- 7) The Ma Powers Memorial is a foursome scramble in its 6th season.
- 8) The "Give a DAM Memorial" (Dixon/Allen/Marcantonio), is a 9-year-old doubles scramble event.
- 9) The Valedictorian is the 2nd of 3 August events...a doubles scramble at Queensbury.
- 10) The other 9-year-old event is the S.O.B. It's the only 4 player best ball tournament. A father and his sons sponsor the 12th annual MGM Grand foursome scramble.
- 11) A father and his sons sponsor the 13th annual MGM Grand. It's the last chance to play a foursome scramble.
- 12) In the 12th annual Red, White and Blue, doubles will play a scramble. And performance on each hole dictates which tee boxes are used on the next hole.
- 13) The AGA Tournament of Champions is an invitational singles event for cash prizes. To receive invitation, a player must do one of the following: (criteria subject to alteration)
 - a) Play in at least 6 regular season events
 - b) Win one regular season event and play in at least 4 events
 - c) Be a past T.O.C. winner and play in 4 regular season events

No gimmies allowed in AGA events. Everything must be holed out.
